<u>Northeast</u>	<p>Mostly heavily wooded area:</p> <p>Farming-corn, squash, pumpkins and beans</p> <p>Hunting- Fishing Hunted deer and beavers</p>	<p>Clothes made from deer hides (skins) and other animals they hunted</p>	<p>Longhouses- These homes were designed for more than one family to live in.</p> <p>Shelter was mostly permanent (did not move) and made from natural resources like trees and bark</p>	<p>Forest for wood to build houses</p> <p>Nearby they had waterways for fishing animals.</p> <p>Hunting animals like deer and beaver</p>

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<u>Southeast</u>	<p>Farming-corn, squash, and beans (these are also known as the Three Sisters)</p> <p>Hunted- deer, raccoon, turtle, bear, turkey and alligators</p>	<p>Wore clothes made of lightweight deer skin.</p> <p>Used cotton or wool</p> <p>Dyed clothes for color using plants like indigo.</p>	<p>Winter home-Wattle and Daub- Made from mud and bark</p> <p>Summer Home-Chickees-built on stilts 3 feet above ground with no walls.</p>	<p>Land Wood Clay Animals</p>

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<u>Plains</u>	<p>Hunted- deer, elk, buffalo</p> <p>Farming- Planted corn, squash, beans (Three Sisters)</p> <p>Most important food source was the buffalo</p>	<p>Parts of the buffalo were used for clothing</p> <p>Clothing depended on location and climate (weather)</p> <p>Clothes were made from animal hide (skin) and animal fur.</p>	<p>Teepees- used to follow the buffalo herds. These homes were easy to move.</p> <p>Some had permanent earthen lodges. These earthen lodges were made of sod or grass)</p>	<p>Buffalo- <u>all parts</u> of the buffalo were used for food, shelter and clothing</p> <p>Land was used to farm</p>
